## Standard Features

- Heavy gauge aluminum headboards with stainless steel liners and hand-sewn metal slide(s) depending on application.
- Woven racing sails are cross-cut using Contender, Dimension/Polyant and Bainbridge fabrics
- Boats over 30ft (9.1mt) l.o.a. are fitted with a two ply head and clew
- Luff and foot attachments (if needed) attached with hand-sewn webbing.
- Reef rings are stainless steel pressed rings with webbing load straps, tack reefs equipped with dual "dogbone" stainless steel rings.
- Corner rings are webbed Stainless Steel external rings.
- Batten pockets finished with our Internal Velcro system.
- Shelf or loose foot, Flattener and Cunningham
- All seams will have 1 to 3 rows of 3-step stitching, depending on application.
- Sails include; 2-3 sets of draft stripes, numbers, and insignia
- Patches are "fan" type radial.
- Kevlar or Spectra "up and over" leechline on boats over 30ft
- Tell-tales at each batten pocket.
- Dimensions maximized at all girth stations.
- Zipper sausage sailbag.

## **Optional Features**

- One or more reefing points.
- Full length battens.
- Seamkote.
